The President's Report

National Dairy Shrine (NDS) experienced a very good year. At last October's board meeting, quite a bit of discussion centered on the need for NDS to develop a social media presence to engage and retain interest from new collegiate members. The organization now has a Facebook page and a new Social Media Committee whose members keep the page updated with fresh information. Furthermore, plans are being developed to make the video history interviews available on public media so more people can enjoy the comments of our industry's leaders.

Thanks to the tireless efforts of Chairman Stan Erwine, fundraising for renovating the Joe Eves Library had its best year yet. Over thirty individuals, organizations and companies invested in the project. Funds received have already been put to use with an updated visitor video, remodeling the champion cow display, and reworking the

youth, breed, and show exhibit area. Fundraising continues to complete the remainder of the Joe Eves Library project, and all NDS members are urged to support their museum. For those planning to attend World Dairy Expo, I encourage you to leave time in your schedule to visit the NDS museum in Ft. Atkinson. It truly is the Hall of Fame for the dairy industry.

Of course the highlight of every year for NDS is its annual banquet, to be held this year on October 4th in conjunction with World Dairy Expo. The banquet provides NDS the opportunity to honor its experienced members and to promote the careers of tomorrow's leaders. As the selection committees reported their award nominees, I was struck by the connections I had to many of the honorees. Guest of Honor Dr. David Galton was NDS President when I was elected to the board. Watching him conduct a board meeting, it was easy to see his passion for the organization. Having worked for the American Jersey Cattle Association for the past 20 years, I'm well familiar with the outstanding herd of Jerseys bred and owned by Distinguished Dairy Cattle Breeder James Huffard. In addition, he's given selflessly of his time and talents to both the AJCA and National All-Jersey boards, as well as to his fellow breeders.

Pioneer recipient Don Seipt was president of the Holstein Association

when I was Executive Secretary of the American Guernsey Cattle Association. Interacting with Don at PDCA meetings, I was impressed by his calm, reasoned thinking as he led that organization through some turbulent times. At the same time another Pioneer recipient George Opperman wrapped up a very successful tenure as Executive Secretary of the Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders Association. Not content to rest on those laurels and supposedly-retired, he developed the U.S. Livestock Genetics Export Council, which continues to promote U.S. genetics 20 years later. Pioneer Frances Eustis created the limited edition model cows for Jersey and Guernsey, and my #13 Guernsey remains one of my prized possessions. A print of Pioneer James Baird's "Foster Mothers of the Human Race" adorned the office wall of my college advisor, Dr. Jack Albright, as well as both the Guernsey and Jersey breed offices. And while I never crossed paths with Dr. Charles Plumb, we both have a connection to Purdue University.

As I thought about my personal connections with this year's honorees, it occurred to me that NDS is primarily about the interactions between people involved in the dairy industry. While we talk a lot about cows and bulls and milk, we're in the people business. Bernie Heisner has referred to World Dairy Expo as homecoming week for the dairy industry. That's true, and NDS is a great fraternity within that industry, with the NDS annual meeting and banquet as the gathering point. As NDS awards \$55,000 in scholarships at the banquet, I

He was the driving force behind the very successful development of the Cornell Dairy Fellows program which provides students with unique opportunities for becoming active members of the dairy production industry. David also is well respected collegiate dairy cattle judging team coach with the highest number of elite contest winners...9 National Champion teams and 8 National Champion individuals.

His artistic skill was utilized to develop custom resin cast true type models for the Brown Swiss, Holstein, Jersey and Guernsey breeds. Distinguished Breeder

The NDS Distinguished Dairy Cattle breeder is James S. Huffard from Crockett, VA. Huffard's Jersey herd carries the Schultz prefix and is known worldwide for producing quality and sought after cattle. Huffard has served on several national & regional Jersey committees and was a leader in development of Dixieland Jersey Sires Inc. He has shown the foresight to utilize innovative breeding and environmental research and has actively worked with his home state university, Virginia Tech, on numerous dairy research projects.

Dr. Charles Plumb, Columbus, Ohio was the first professor of Dairying at Purdue University in 1890. There he started the Indiana State Dairy Association. He later became professor of Animal Husbandry at Ohio State University from 1902 until 1931. The Ohio State University in 1932 named the building housing the Dairy Department as Plumb Hall to honor Dr. Plumb.

Pioneers

Don Seipt, Easton, PA., a well respected dairy leader, served as President of the U.S. Holstein Association during some of the toughest financial times of the association. His Keystone herd was one of the most respected Holstein herds for longevity and high production.

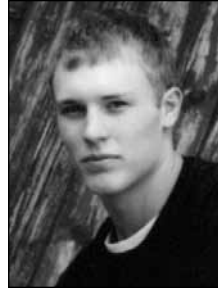
