Dear National Dairy Shrine Members:

They pass the collection plate at church every Sunday; various charities make phone calls or mail appeals for funds every month or so; even public universities have campaigns to raise funds at least once or twice a year from their alumni and friends; thus we hope you will respond positively when National Dairy Shrine (NDS) asks you to consider making a helpful gift through the first organized gift seeking campaign in a generation. . . IT'S TIME. WILL YOU HELP?

The last time National Dairy Shrine asked for significant gift support started in 1974 when a goal of \$250,000 was set to fund the construction of a home to showcase the dairy industry in what is now the National Dairy Shrine Visitors' Center as part of the Hoard Historical Museum in Fort Atkinson, Wisconsin.

Tremendous stewardship of those gifts, excellent maintenance and care of the exhibits and an organization that relies on non-paid, non-reimbursed volunteer leadership has allowed National Dairy Shrine to function at a high level for an entire generation. In recent years National Dairy Shrine has presented more than \$30,000 annually in encouraging scholarships and awards.

It's time. Will you help? Exhibits wear out and need to be redone, refurbished or refreshed. NDS has completed a Phase I Remodeling project, which cost \$60,000. Thanks to some generous help from a couple of allied industry organizations, we have new audio-visual equipment that is in place and running well as compared to the old, worn out equipment that required frequent and highly creative repair techniques in recent years

However, the National Dairy Shrine board has identified the following items as Phase II Refurbishing & Revitalizing Projects that will cost an estimated \$100,000:

1. New Hall of Fame area or a room to display pictures of Guest of Honor, Pioneer and Distinguished Breeder recipients to be featured downstairs, with educational exhibits upstairs.
2. Scan all photos (people, cows, etc.) electronically so they can be stored and recovered in case of a disaster.
3. Additional lighting
4. New carpeting and a new paint job

This is an important project. We hope you see fit to help.

Just as a plaque documents all who provided the support which led to the opening of the National Dairy Shrine Visitors' Center in 1981, another plaque acknowledging all who contribute at designated levels to this current National Dairy Shrine Refurbishing & Revitalizing Project will also occupy a prominent spot in the Shrine's home.

Guest of Honor...is NDS's highest award. It recognizes a living contemporary dairy leader for achievements contributing significantly to the dairy industry.

Distinguished Dairy Cattle Breeder...is presented to active, operating dairy producers who own and breed dairy cattle. Family groups, such as husband-wife, father-son, and brother-sister, are eligible as partnership teams.

Pioneer...awards are presented to living or deceased persons who contributed significantly to the dairy industry during their lifetimes. Three or four persons are recognized annually.

Progressive Dairy

Producers...two cash awards (\$2,000 each) are presented for educational travel to outstanding young dairymen (21 to 45 years of age) in two herd size categories; less than 300 cows and 301 cows or more.

Kildee Scholarships...the top 25 contestants in the past three National Intercollegiate Dairy Cattle Judging contests are eligible to apply for up to two \$3,000 scholarships for advanced study related to the dairy industry. The top 25 contestants in the National 4-H and FFA Dairy Judging Contests are eligible to compete for a \$2,000 college scholarship.

Dairy Student Recognition

Program...is to recognize and reward graduating seniors planning a career related to dairy production. Winner receives a \$1,500 cash award, \$1,000 for second and three to seven \$500 cash awards (depending on the number and quality of applicants).

National Dairy Shrine/Dairy Management Inc. (DMI) Milk Marketing Scholarships...to encourage students to pursue careers in the marketing of dairy products. Seven thousand dollars

awarded annually, \$6,000 provided by DMI and \$1,000 provided by NDS.

McCullough Scholarships...two scholarships (\$2,500 and \$1,000) awarded annually to high school seniors planning to enter a 4-year college or university with intent to major in: Dairy/Animal Science with a communications emphasis or Agricultural Journalism with a Dairy/Animal Science emphasis.

NDS/Klussendorf Scholarship...a \$1,000 scholarship for a first, second or third year student at a 2-year or 4-year college or University. Applicants must major in a Dairy or Animal Science curriculum with plans to enter the dairy cattle field.

NDS/Iager Dairy Scholarship...

One \$1,000 scholarship to a second year college student in a 2-year agricultural college.

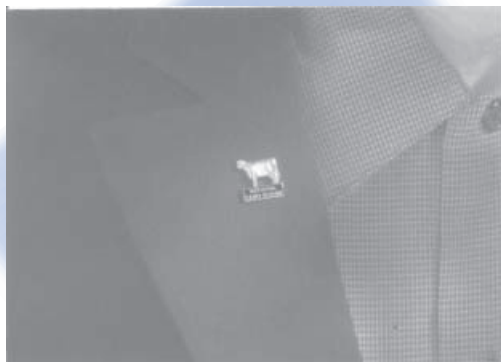

“Upgrade Your Entire Wardrobe for FIFTY BUCKS” is Our New Advertising Program.

An effective new advertising campaign is now appearing in dairy magazines, resulting in new members for National Dairy Shrine. The campaign, with the headline “Upgrade your entire wardrobe for FIFTY BUCKS,” was created by Morgan&Myers, an agricultural advertising agency based in Jefferson, Wisconsin. The agency provided the time and talents of a copywriter and artist to develop the campaign at no charge to our organization.



“We developed ads in several sizes, in both color and black and white, and sent them to about 30 agricultural and dairy publishers across the country.” says Karen Potratz, senior counselor at Morgan&Myers and a former National Dairy Shrine board member.

“An accompanying letter told the publishers about NDS and invited them to run the ads in their

publications at no charge as a service to the dairy industry.”
