Survey Guides Long Term Plan

L ast fall the National Dairy Shrine conducted a membership survey. With nearly 200 members responding, the survey provided great insights into how members feel about their organization, and will offer guidance toward developing future initiatives.

The National Dairy Shrine mission covers four pillars: honoring the past to preserve the history of the dairy industry, inspiring future leaders, managing the National Dairy Shrine museum and advocating for the dairy industry. When asked the importance of each of those mission pillars, respondents indicated that inspiring future leaders was at the top of the list. This shows that the commitment that Dairy Shrine makes toward providing scholarships to college students is following the correct path.

Results show that members feel the Dairy Shrine is providing an adequate number of adult awards as well as scholarships. While members indicated their support of the value of the scholarships, there is an indication that the value of the scholarships could be increased to reflect the rising costs associated with attending college.

When asked about membership fees, a majority of respondents indicated support for raising the lifetime membership fee.

While the results were very supportive and informative, the value of the data resides in how the results are used to make decisions regarding the future of your organization. This spring your Board of Directors will be developing a National Dairy Shrine long range plan and this survey information will play a key role in assembling that plan. Our goal is to have a full plan available for review by next fall.



Fund Raising Program Kicks Off
